Overview: about Vinehealth

About Us

The Phylloxera and Grape Industry Board of South Australia, trading as Vinehealth Australia is an independent South Australian statutory authority established in 1899, with a single-minded focus on grape and wine biosecurity. The organisation obtains its powers and functions from its governing legislation, the Phylloxera and Grape Industry Act 1995 (Act) and is fully funded by the state's 3,000 vineyard owners through a mandatory levy based on area of planted vines.

The overriding aim of the Act is to provide for the protection of vineyards from pests, with a core focus on phylloxera, and to assist and support the grape and wine industry in South Australia. A key function of Vinehealth Australia is to maintain a Register of all 74,500 hectares of vineyard in the state, being half of the national wine industry's plantings. The Register enables Vinehealth Australia to work together with industry and government to prepare for, prevent and respond to an outbreak of a significant pest or disease. The Register also provides significant insights for industry and government and is a highly valued resource.

OUR PURPOSE

To foster a profitable, sustainable and reputable grape and wine industry, by working alongside growers, winemakers, propagation specialists and government to protect vines from biosecurity risk and to advance vine health.

OUR VISION

Biosecurity action is integrated in every grape and wine business.

OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Knowledge: Pursuing new knowledge to empower evidence-based decision making by industry and government.

Action: Completing targeted, high impact biosecurity activities that deliver measurable change in biosecurity practices by industry, government and other priority stakeholders.

REGIONAL EXPERIENCE:


The regions surrounding Adelaide offer a unique experience with gourmet food offerings, internationally renowned wine, villages to explore and wildlife and natural attractions.
